SUBJECT: INTERVIEW OF STEVEN CHEVASHORE ON APRIL 24, 1989

At approximately 8:00 PM on April 24, 1989, I called Steven Chevashore at 212/362-2632. The phone rang for at least five minutes before he answered. Chevashore immediately told me that he was injured and could not talk with me. I asked him the nature of his injury, and he told me that he had a broken arm which occurred within the past few days. He claimed he hurt it by throwing a baseball. Chevashore explained that he had not played baseball in better than 20 years prior to the injury, and could offer no explanation as to why he suddenly went back to the game.

Chevashore refused to discuss anything pertaining to the Rose matter. He claimed that he had visited an attorney and was advised not to talk to representatives of the Commissioner's Office.

Steven Chevashore is 40 years old and is as non-athletic a person as you could find. There is reason to believe that Chevashore may have been reminded by persons unknown that his "baseball injury" could become more serious should he elect to tell all.
