

On April 28, 1989, Mark Stowe, Assistant Clubhouse Manager, Cincinnati Reds, telephonically furnished the following information to BRI Investigator Joseph E. Daly:

After yesterday's meeting he has been thinking about the information he furnished earlier and he can't remember exactly what Rose said regarding Paul Janszen.

The third and fourth paragraphs of his March 21, 1989 interview were read to him. He said everything sounded right except the second sentence of the third paragraph which he said "sorta" sounds like what he heard Rose say.

Stowe said Rose told him the information about Janszen after Rose returned from his meeting with the Commissioner this spring. Stowe said there was a fan on in Rose's bathroom at the spring facility when Rose told him this and therefore Stowe didn't hear it very well.

Stowe said he had gone to dinner with Janszen around April, 1988. Stowe said Janszen gave Stowe the impression that Rose would tell Janszen to place bets and if Rose lost, Rose wouldn't pay and that Janszen had put up his own money for the bet. Stowe also had the impression that the money Rose owed Janszen wasn't for one bet but had built up over a period of time.

Stowe said Rose also said Janszen owed "us" (Rose and Stowe) over \$10,000 for signing baseballs for Janszen. Stowe said he signed over 200 of the baseballs for Rose. He said Janszen's girlfriend, Danita Marcum, brought the baseballs to the clubhouse in a garbage can on wheels on more than one occasion in 1988. The balls were not in boxes.

Stowe said Rose showed more interest than anyone else in every single football game score in the league so he assumes Rose was betting on them.

Stowe said Danita Marcum "hung out" at the stadium all the time in 1988 getting balls signed, but Paul Janszen wasn't there in 1988 and wasn't there much in 1987.
