

Re: 1975 Pete Kose ring

Dear Ed:

The following account is, to my best recollection, the way we became involved with the above ring. Sometime in March, 1987, a gentleman who worked as a supervisor in our ring plant came into my office and informed me that his uncle, whom we now know as Joe Cambra, was a personal friend of Peta Rose and wanted me to contact Peta in reference Lo the loss of his 1975 World Series ring. He told me Pete wished to give this ring to him as a birthday gift. My concern at that time, as in every case, was accountability. I asked this gentleman to have Petc Rose write a letter to me indicating his desire to purchase this ring. Over a period of two to three months this gentleman kept asking me il Pete had called. I replied that he had not until one day he came into my office and informed me that Pete was in Cincinnati and would like me to call him at one of the three numbers which are on the attached letter. I called Pete and he requested a replacement order be initiated for this particular ring. I asked him to send me a letter authorizing me to make the ring.

Upon receiving the letter there were some questions as to what type of ring he was referring to as none of these rings be described was a 1975 World Series ring. He specifically told me 1975.

I turned over the ordering process to one of my people who apparently ordered this ring and the rest is history. Many of our records do not go back to 1987 and we had to do extensive rescarch to come up with: Pete's letter.
